



In response to your questions, the answers are as follows:

- 1. Do you track how long the vehicles are out when they are picking up ballots from drop boxes? Or how long it takes vehicles to drop off ballots after they are picked up from a ballot drop box? No, we do not track exactly how long it takes the teams to pick up drop boxes. However, we know when the teams start and have a good estimate of the time it will take for the team to finish their assignment.
- 2. When the ballots from a drop box are put into a bag, are they sealed at the pick up site? For example, with a zip tie? Yes, they are sealed.
- 3. In the field, are the ballots from a drop box kept in a bag only with ballots from that drop box? Or are they mixed with ballots from other drop boxes? Yes, we hire reliable teams to pick up ballots. The ballots are not mixed with ballots from other drop boxes. Pick-up bags are sealed, and then transported directly to the County Government Center.
- 4. Do you track who is picking up ballots and which drop boxes they will pick them up from? Yes. The teams have assigned locations.
- 5. Do you allow watchers when you empty and transport ballots from ballot drop boxes? Yes. Are there chain of custody logs or spreadsheets where data about the ballot drop boxes is tracked? Yes





Hi Justin, Mr. semail is full of inaccurate statements. I have never spoken to him and yet he said, "the Salt Lake County Clerk told me my only option to vote was to go to a physical polling location to use a talking machine (when no other citizen is forced to do this) or to sacrifice my right to a secret ballot by having a friend help me fill out the ballot. That is blatantly untrue. He first sent an email to our public got-vote email on September
28 th . He then sent an email to you on October 1 st saying that he had sent me a message four days prior and I hadn't answered. We started working on a process with Mark Pemberton, our IT Manager, to figure out how we might deploy a voting machine to some once we got that resolved, my Chief Deputy Lannie Chapman
called on October 7 th . We couldn't schedule an appointment for him before the early voting period begins on October 20 th . Below is Lannie's email about that phone conversation with
"Hi Sherrie, I spoke with to the phone, on October 7th. He had requested that we bring a touch screen voting machine (with an ADA assessible/VIBS unit) to his house to allow him to vote. Before calling the working we wanted to figure out the logistics of setting up at-home ADA accessible voting once early voting started. As I spoke with him, I confirmed his full name and address with him. He requested that we make the appointment on a Wednesday, as he works from home on Wednesdays. We agreed to a 9:30 am appointment. The staff that will be setting up and providing the at home voting, will also be training our poll workers, so we had very narrow timeframes available. In other words, we had to be very conscious of the time commitment to setting up, allowing the voter to vote, and tearing down before we proposed times for us to provide this service to to the conclusion of our call I believed was satisfied with what we offered him; allowing him to vote for the 2020 General Election.

A few weeks ago I contacted your office requesting assistance voting as a blind person after the Salt Lake County Clerk told me my only option to vote was to go to a physical polling location to use a talking machine (when no other citizen is forced to do this) or to sacrifice my right to a secret ballot by having a friend help me fill out the ballot. Both of these options are illegal, discriminatory, and unacceptable, especially since the technology and free federal money exist to solve this problem, and the clerk has known of this issue for years and refuses to do anything about it.

After I spent many days and weeks contacting multiple state and federal politicians, fighting for my right to vote, to resolve my issue, the clerk is sending someone to my home with a voting machine so I can cast a ballot from home in a equivalent matter to a sighted person voting by mail.

I have a blind friend who, like me, lives alone. I told him of the Clerk's plan to accommodate my disability by sending a voting machine to my house. He is interested and also has a need for a similar accommodation. He has contacted the clerk's office twice since Friday, 10/9/2020 and has left voicemails requesting this accommodation, and thus far his messages are being ignored and not returned. I did not know the clerk has the right to violate his civil right to vote by ignoring his request and refusing to return his voice mail. This issue needs to be addressed and fixed. A citizen of this state and nation should not have his right to vote violated by a clerk who refuses to do her job now by not returning his phone calls and accommodating his blindness, as she has refused to do her job in the past when she failed to address this issue over the many years she has known of it.

Please order Ms. Swensen to answer her phone, return voice mails, and accommodate this blind voter and any other blind citizens who make this accommodation request.

Dear Lt. Governor Cox and Mr. Lee:

I represent relating to issues involving their voter registration status. I am writing to you pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 20510(b), which authorizes a private right of action for violations of the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA). Section 20510(b)(2) requires a private individual to provide notice of the violation to the chief election official and allow that official 90 days to correct the matter prior to commencing a civil action. This letter represents the notice to you of NVRA violations and begins the 90-day period to correct the matter.

The NVRA specifically addresses how a state may maintain its voter registration rolls. Under 52 U.S.C. § 20507(d)(1), a state may not remove a registrant's name on change-of-residence grounds unless either: (A) the registrant confirms in writing that he or she has moved or (B) the registrant fails to return a preaddressed, postage prepaid "return card" containing statutorily prescribed content. This card must explain what a registrant who has not moved needs to do in order to stay on the rolls, *i.e.*, either return the card or vote during the period covering the next two general federal elections. If the state does not send such a card or otherwise get written notice that the person has moved, it may not remove the registrant on change-of-residence grounds.

Moreover, the NVRA specifically provides that "no registrant may be removed solely by reason of a failure to vote." *Id.* § 21083(a)(4)(A).

We understand your concerns. If any of us had advanced notice on this, we would have planned it out ahead of time. This is all a result of activity that the CISO's office has noticed recently and doesn't feel like we can/should ignore. As I mentioned to you on the phone yesterday, the CISO has assured me of the following:

This should be seamless to most users within the state.

 Most of the IP addresses should already be open. Anybody currently using the state's network or Verizon hot spots are open, as well as any known VISTA Local users.

• If they see safe traffic hitting the network, they will open it immediately, so it shouldn't impact any of your ballot processing operations.

· I did make him aware of your usage of hot spots, and he indicated they can deal with that easily.

· As it stands now, they are monitoring the network closely and will only take the actions

they deem necessary to secure our election.

• DTS will have additional staff on hand Monday and Tuesday to take care of any IP addresses that need to be opened. Your staff can call or email me (email is preferred since I only have one phone line), and I'll work directly with the security staff to get them opened immediately. My email is markm@utah.gov and my cell number is

I reviewed this all with the CISO just now. He assured me again, that they will only take actions deemed necessary. So we may notice nothing at all. If you or your staff do have trouble connecting with VISTA Local, please email me at markm@utah.gov. I have the CISO's assurance that they can open any type of connection very quickly.


