Election machine vendors and ballot printing firms are allowed to make campaign contributions to County Clerks, who participate in purchasing decisions for those services



Virtually no one in NJ is allowed to audit or examine the many parts of the election process, and machine vendors claim exclusive proprietary secrecy, blocking examination or verification of election systems



In Nov. 2020, there were active voter registrations and ballots cast from addresses associated with prisons and detention facilities, welfare offices, campgrounds, board of elections offices, vacant lots, and abandoned buildings, to name a few.



Motor vehicle transactions automatically register individuals as voters unless they opt out in writing. This has created duplicate registrations, or two voter ID numbers for a single voter.

Roadblocks

Government not working for We the People

- The 1947 NJ Constitution consolidates ALL power in the Governor, who appoints the Justices of the Courts, the Secretary of State, Attorney General, and all other members of his Cabinet (he and the Lieutenant Governor are elected on the same ticket). There is no initiative and referendum. The Governor controls the administrative branch, owns the (Democratic) legislature for the past 25 years, and does the rest by Executive Order.

Data

- 4 NJ counties changed their election equipment vendors and terminated their contracts post 2020, and now say that they can no longer access their data from the 2020 General Election without paying Dominion Voting Systems a special assessment fee of \$235/hour to generate the reports from Nov. 2020.
- Several NJ counties claim that the election data is the property of the election equipment vendors, and that the county is not permitted to see it.

Citizen Action

- Citizen contact with all 21 counties and the Secretary of State's office in a massive effort to secure all election-related data. For example: voter rolls, voter history reports, cast vote records, ballot images, etc. This effort has been very successful.
- Educating citizens

CVRs

- As a result of efforts to bring awareness, and information shared with the counties, several of the boards of elections will now be producing the Cast Vote Record after every election, and will make this information available to the public

Ocean County

- Ocean County, NJ - citizen groups are working with the commissioners to eliminate all drop boxes; and there is a citizen lawsuit pending regarding the lack of security video footage for the drop boxes from Nov. 2020.
