Reason for Hope: Lawsuit Success



California

- Election Integrity Project California (EIP-CA) lawsuit includes thousands of reports of serious election irregularities in 43 out of 58 counties.
 - Irregularities include: not vetting signatures & counting ballots without signatures.
 - The case has been referred back to the Ninth Circuit, where it was previously held that EIP-CA had standing.
- EIP-CA lawsuit joined by Judicial Watch found that Los Angeles County had 482k more registrants than eligible voters and over 1.5m inactive registrants.
 - Under the settlement agreement, Los Angeles County removed 1.2m ineligible voters from its rolls in 2022.



Reason for Hope: Hand Count Success



California

- Shasta County Board of Supervisors voted to terminate their Dominion Voting Systems contract.
- Weeks following the vote, the California Legislature introduced a bill (AB 969) that would require counties to have a transition plan and replacement contract with a state-certified machine vendor.
- The bill will require the use of machines in elections that have 1000 or more registered voters in any precinct.
- AB 969 has passed the Assembly and is currently in the Senate as of August 14, 2023.
