Thanks Curtis, LG's office, and everyone who helped make this bill so much less bad than it was! Your emails, texts and phone calls to your senators made a difference. Senator Bramble mentioned on the floor that they were getting "inundated" with concerns. That would be us voicing our concerns!

As far as issues, there are three minor ones:

- Line 273 defines Protective Counter – This should be erased from the code
- Line 284 refers to "Provisional Ballot Envelope" Should refer to the "Provisional Ballot Form"
- Line 1599 refers to Nov 15 as the cutoff date for determining signatures. This is during the canvass period for the municipal elections. Late registrations and provisionals will not be entered in, although this has only a small impact on the numbers of signatures to it may be okay.

And one more important one:

- Line 1044 states each county shall have two vote centers for election dates and runoff elections. Two is arbitrary and may not make sense in rural counties. In some cases it doesn't make sense for larger ones. Let us make these types of decision and not codify them, or let's reduce the minimum required number of vote centers to one to accommodate smaller counties.

We certainly don't want to push hard, especially after we were able to arrive at a compromise, so we'll rely on your best judgment on these items.

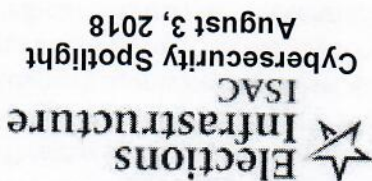

Social Engineering

What it is: Social engineering is the use of deception to manipulate individuals into providing a particular response, generally for a fraudulent or malicious purpose. This can occur via all forms of communication, including email, text message, phone call, social media, and in-person. Prior to targeting, social engineers typically gather information about an individual or organization using publicly available resources. Offices and officials that regularly interface with the public are uniquely susceptible to social engineering due to the expectation of quality customer service.

Why does it matter: Strategic targeting of a particular individual or small group often includes multiple social engineering components and is hard to distinguish from legitimate activity. For instance, a socially engineered email to an election official might appear to come from an organization the official works closely with, such as a vendor, the EI-ISAC, or a state or local officials association. Social engineers may also reference a current event the official will likely care about, such as recent Congressional testimony on securing the elections. Another common social engineering tactic is to convey a sense of urgency to distract targets from potential inconsistencies in the threat actor's request. Emails to election officials that use this technique might indicate a deadline for response, such as providing comments before a meeting.

Threat actors also routinely use telephone calls to collect or change information in order to gain access to online accounts and remote networks. This technique has been used to gain access to government executives' personal and professional email and social media accounts, as well as to trick employees into falling for tech support call scams.

From a cyber perspective, the goal of social engineering could be to get the target to respond to an email and engage in a dialogue with the threat actor, download malware, transfer money, or go to a website and provide login credentials. All of these actions could lead to a compromise of professional or personal accounts, as well as computer networks. From a physical perspective, social engineers could attempt to gain access to restricted areas or documents to access or modify sensitive information and systems.

What you can do: Due to their public facing role, election officials must be especially vigilant for potential social engineering. Election offices should have policies in place to prevent social engineering and all staff should participate in social engineering training that includes information about all forms of social engineering, including in-person and telephone-based attempts. Additionally, use caution when providing information online and to outside entities, including social media posts, as cyber threat actors can gather this information to learn more about you and craft social engineered lures tailored to you. As a general rule of thumb, if an email, text message, phone call, or other interaction seems unexpected or out of the norm, review it for cues that might indicate it was from a threat actor and be sure to verify to identity of the individual.

FYI: Make sure you're backing up your data

Howdy everyone,

Baltimore City got hit by ransomware back in May. They're almost done recovering, but some of their data is lost forever. The main reason for this is because some employees stored key spreadsheets and reports only on their computers, and didn't back them up.

Here's what the auditor said in a report given to the city council, "One of the things I've learned in my short time here is a great number of Baltimore city employees store entity information on their local computers. And that's it," Pasch reportedly told councilors at the meeting." (<https://www.governing.com/news/headlines/Audit-Baltimore-Data-Losses-Due-to-Insufficient-Backups-Poor-Internal-Controls.html>)

Hopefully your I.T. folks provide a way for you to store, or backup, or both, all of your data on a network that is also routinely backed up and fully recoverable. If you're not sure, you may want to ask. And backing up to the Cloud doesn't guarantee full recovery, if the Cloud isn't properly secured.

Backing up your files is cheap, straightforward and doesn't take long, and it could avoid big headaches if something bad were to happen to your computer or to the network. The bad guys are targeting counties and cities of all sizes, not just the big ones.

FYI - just a heads up that they're talking about having prepaid return postage, to be reimbursed by stimulus funding.

Rep. Hall called me and had some concern over the combination of releasing results at 10 PM AND allowing election day postmarking. He asked if we would be OK to release results at 11:59 PM instead. I said that what would be better is to not change the postmark deadline at all, as it will confuse voters come November, and will require many counties to reprint envelopes.

Here's some thoughts from Derek/Justin regarding prepaid reimbursement:

The federal funds could be used for pre-paid postage if we expect a higher percentage of absentee ballots. But because the counties already sent a ballot to all voters, an increase of absentee ballots due to the pandemic is not likely. Additionally, the federal funds cannot supplant funds already allocated or budgeted. We may have to get definitive guidance from the EAC on our situation, but my first impression is that counties that already budgeted and planned to provide pre-paid postage are not eligible for the federal funds.

So the wild ride with HB218 appears to be (hopefully) coming to an end. Of course, it's not over until it's over, but as of right now, this bill is a win. Here's some highlights of what it does:

- Does NOT eliminate VBM (although the language would refer to VBM elections as "absentee elections").
- Provides a way for counties that are currently not VBM to be able to become VBM.
- Requires people who apply for a driver license to mark "yes" or "no" to the question about whether they want to register (that means this bill is NOT Automatic Voter Registration – it simply requires the person to make a choice of whether to register or not).
- Requires voters who want to be registered, to mark "yes" or "no" to the questions of whether they want to receive a ballot by mail.
- Requires the Driver License Division to electronically provide voter data to the LG's office, including address changes and new registrations.
- Allows for voters to request that their record be made private (a possible substitute by Rep. Lisonbee may be offered on the House floor that would remove the requirement that the voter provide a reason why they want their record made private. Based on our discussions of this issue in the past, I told her that we're fine with that language).
- Prevents clerks from mailing a ballot to inactive voters and voters who don't vote in two consecutive general elections.
- Requires early voting, but give clerks authority to have it be as little as four days (no requirement on how many early voting locations – so the clerk's office can be the early voting site). HB141 was also amended to four days instead of two. Our group supports HB141 as well, although if it doesn't pass, and 218 passes, we'll still have the authority to shorten early voting.
- Requires clerks to have at least one vote center for every 5,000 voters *who are not receiving a ballot in the mail*.

The bill is currently circled on the House 3rd reading calendar, and could be considered at any time. Please consider contacting your Representative(s) ASAP indicating your support for this bill. It's the result of hours of negotiation and back-and-forth, and we think we're in a pretty good spot with the bill as it is right now.

A big thank you to those who worked tremendously hard on getting the bill to this point – it's changed a lot! Now let's all help get it past the finish line.

There is another withdrawal rule in the statute that pertains to municipal elections. It is found in Section 20A-9-203(12), and unlike the rule mentioned above, it *does* include a time restriction. It reads: “Any person who filed a declaration of candidacy *and was nominated*, and any person who *was nominated by a nomination petition*, may, any time up to 23 days before the election, withdraw the nomination by filing a written affidavit with the clerk.”

This 23-day limit only has application to candidates who receive a formal nomination. Nominations can only be received by prevailing at a municipal primary election (*see* Section 20A-1-102(49)), or through the petition process described in Section 20A-9-203(6) to (11). For candidates who fit this description, they are barred from withdrawing from a race within 23 days before the election.
