







Reason for Hope

Oklahoma

OK

- Nearly all Oklahomans vote on paper ballots (not security paper). Exceptions include UOCAVA and disabled voters.
- Voter ID is required but MAY use Voter ID Card, which does NOT have a photo.
- NO drop boxes, even during the pandemic scare.
- NO ranked-choice (petition may be coming).
- County election boards are tasked with maintaining voter rolls; need reward for doing so.
- Statewide voter training educated on State Laws that grant election oversight to certain groups.
- NO true audits are done since digital election files are considered "protected;" only recounts are allowed.
- Voted to remove ERIC from the multi-state voter registration system law and put in guardrails.
- Oklahoma law allows for a variety of petitions for voters to change election law.
- Absentee ballots will now be added to precinct totals.

Reason for Hope: Lawsuit Success

- Court of Public Opinion the alleged evidence is insurmountable. Many do not understand how officials can certify with all of the anomalies being mentioned.
- Irregularities Complaint filed in Tulsa County reports that voters were not being given a city councilman candidate's ballots. An investigation was done- and the poll workers were fired and a public apology was made for the mix up.
- Growing Interest of Oklahomans wanting to understand the election process.
- Lawsuits brought by Citizens (Pro Se)
- Case # 120,659 8-29-2022 Petition for Declaratory Judgment and Emergency Relief Against Electronic Voting Systems and Destruction of Records in the Supreme Court of Oklahoma. (*Dismissed on Standing*)
- HAVA Hearing at State Election Board
- Case# 2023-01 Title III complaints on Audit Capacity and Error Rate Certifications
- We contested that we cannot audit properly without access to the digital documentation of elections which would provide the proof that the voting machines are accurate. (*Dismissed*)

Reason for Hope: Hand Count Success

Oklahoma

- Oklahoma has a standard for hand counting ballots that allows for the total counts by precinct to be confirmed.
- April 4, 2023 Election Recount filed for a City Councilman Race in Norman, OK
 - Election officials successfully counted the same number of ballots being reported online and lined up with the county's official certified results.
- June 28, 2022 Election Recount filed for a District Attorney Race in OK County
 - Chain of Custody is in question
 - Final Counts were officially off by 6
